CAFOD

You will be aware that East Africa is currently experiencing the worst drought in

Almost 60 years, affecting people in Somalia, Kenya, Ethiopia, Sudan and Eritrea. While great progress has been made in supporting communities to cope with droughts, the scale of this disaster is outstripping all local capacity to act as it comes on the heels of two drought affected years. The number of people affected is immense, with tens of thousands already on the move in search of water, pasture and food.

The estimate of those affected is 3.2 million in Ethiopia and 3.1 million in Kenya with an overall estimate of up to 10 million people in the whole region.

Given the gravity of the situation and the urgent need to respond quickly, the UK's Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC), of which CAFOD is a member, has decided to launch an appeal and emergency response with immediate effect. As part of this response CAFOD is launching its own £5m appeal so that Catholics can choose to give directly to CAFOD. We have already written to the Bishops of England and Wales to explain the situation.
